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Music Intent, Implementation and Impact Statement

Curriculum Intent

At Broom Barns Primary school, children gain a firm understanding of what music is through listening, singing, playing, evaluating and composing across a wide variety of musical genres. We want to ensure that children understand the value and importance of music to their own and other's lives and wellbeing and also the impact music has in the wider community.

Implementation

- Charanga Music Scheme is used throughout the school. This ensures children sing, listen, play, perform and evaluate as per the Primary Music Curriculum
- Weekly singing assemblies take place for KS1 and KS2.
- Music is taught through all areas of the curriculum in EYFS.
- Various concerts, celebration assemblies and performances are carried out throughout the year.
- Year 4 learn a musical instrument such as the violin, cello, double base or viola via First Access. This is delivered by Herts Music Service.
- CPD for staff subject knowledge to ensure a good music curriculum is being taught throughout the school.
- Staff plan and deliver lessons in conjunction with Charanga and the National Curriculum

Impact

- Children will achieve age related expectations by the end of the year.
- For children to understand the relevance of what they are learning within music and to enjoy their musical experiences within school.
- Opportunities for improved well-being and confidence will be increased
- Children will gain the experience and confidence of performing to an audience.
- Children will gain a very good awareness and appreciation of different musical traditions and genres.
