4. Disagree

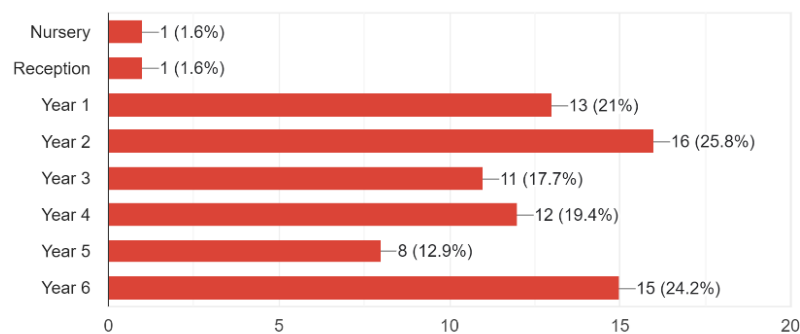
Parents were invited to give written feedback at the end of the survey.

1. My child/children are in year...

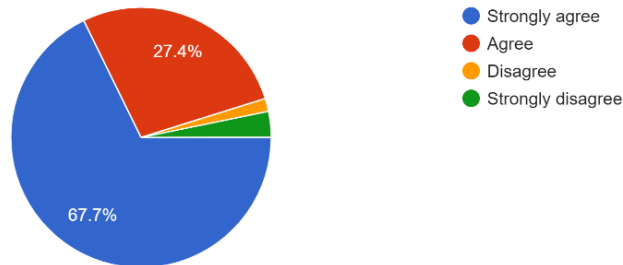

Questions and Analysis

Question 1: My child feels safe at this school

My child feels safe at this school.

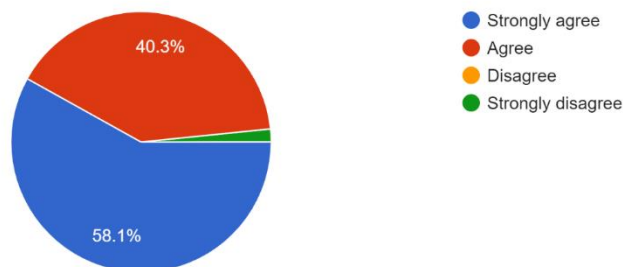

Analysis

- The large majority of parents agree that their child feels safe at Broom Barns.
- There is an increase of 1% of parents who disagree that their child feels safe in this school since last year. This is not significant.
- All 3 parents who disagreed had pupils in different year groups. Two of these pupils had SEND. However, 1 of the parents of the pupils with SEND strongly agreed that the school also gives their child what they need to succeed.
- There were no further comments made by the parents who disagreed.

Question 2: The school makes sure it's pupils are well behaved

The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved.

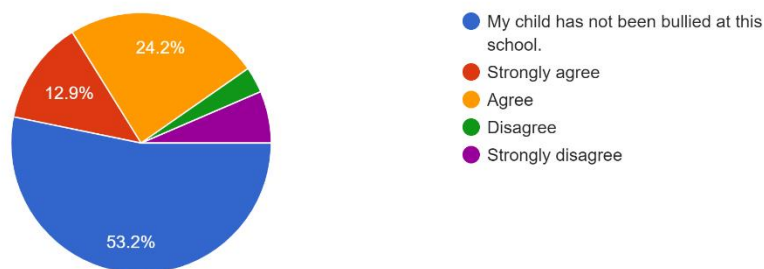

Analysis

- The large majority of parents agree that the school makes sure that pupils are well behaved.
- There is an increase of 2.1% of parents who agree that there the school makes sure that it's pupils are well behaved since last year. This is not significant.

Question 3: My child has been bullied at this school and the school dealt with the bullying quickly and effectively

Analysis

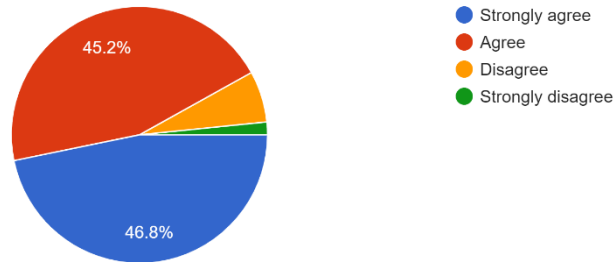
- The large majority of parents agree that the school deals with bullying effectively.
- There is an increase of 7.9% of parents who feel that their child has been bullied since last year.
- There has been an increase of 5.9% of parents who feel that the school has not dealt with the bullying effectively.
- There is a mismatch between the parent questionnaires and parent and staff reports of bullying on CPOMS.
- There were no further comments made by the parents who disagreed.

Actions

- Although the increase in parents disagreeing that the school deals with bullying effectively is not significant, senior leaders should continue to monitor to ensure that there is not an ongoing downward trend.
- Senior leaders to ensure that all school staff understand how to record bullying on CPOMS.
- Information to be provided to parents on the correct terminology and use of the term bullying.

Question 4: The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year

Analysis

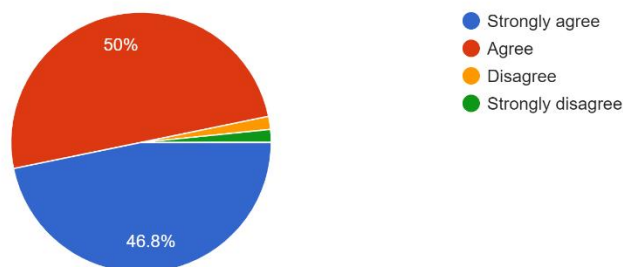
- The large majority of parents agree that the school makes them aware of what their child will be learning.
- There is an increase of 4.9% of parents who feel that the school make them aware of what their child is learning. This may be as a result of the recently introduced Book-looks.
- There was one comment left by a parent who disagreed who suggested that they were not always aware of which topic their child was studying. This was a parent of a pupil in year 2.

Actions

- Senior leaders to consider adding topic titles for each term in a newsletter or individual communication.
- Continue to embed the use of book-looks.
- Re-introduce stay and play sessions in early years.

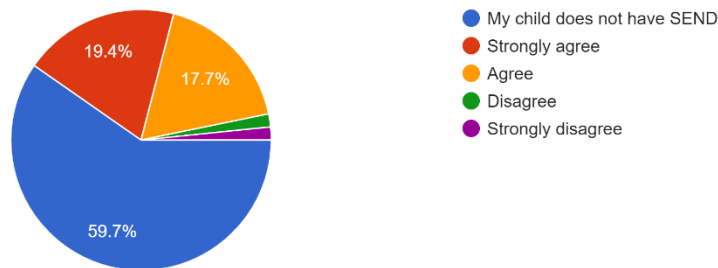

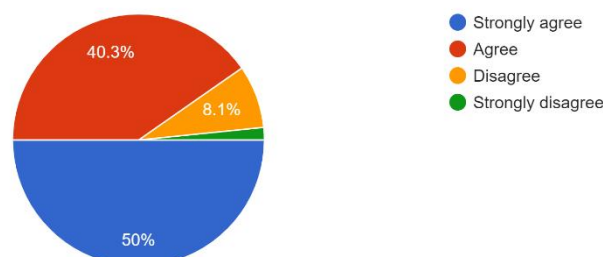

Analysis

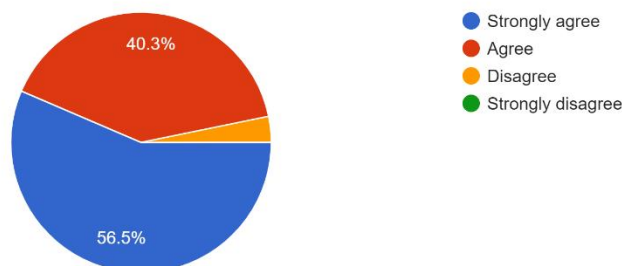
- The large majority of parents agree that the school has high expectations for their child.
- There is an increase of 5.9% of parents who feel that the school does not have high expectations for their child.
- There was one comment left by a parent who disagreed who suggested that they were not always aware of which topic their child was studying. This was a parent of a pupil in year 2. The pupil did not have SEND.

Actions

- Senior leaders to consider adding topic titles for each term in a newsletter or individual communication.
- All staff to continue to explore ways in which expectations for individual pupils can be communicated.

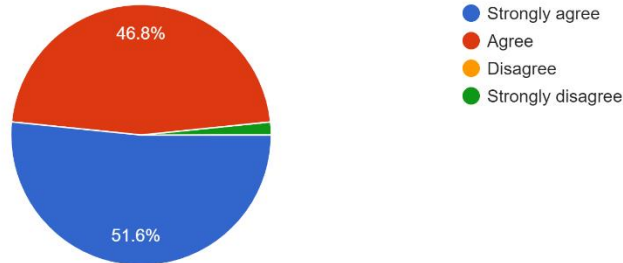

62 responses



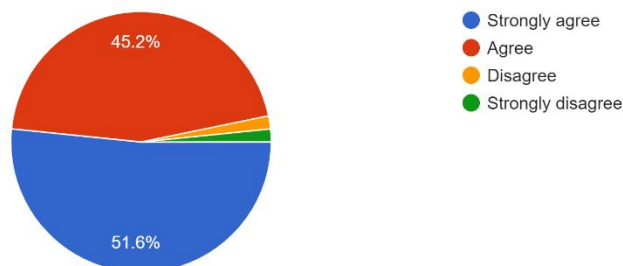

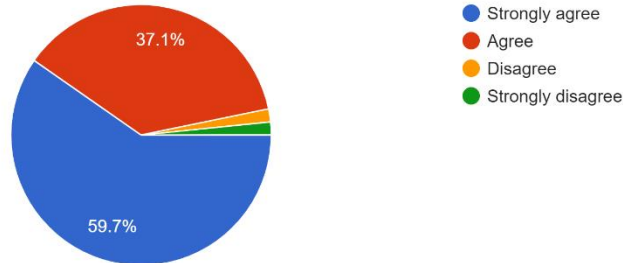

62 responses



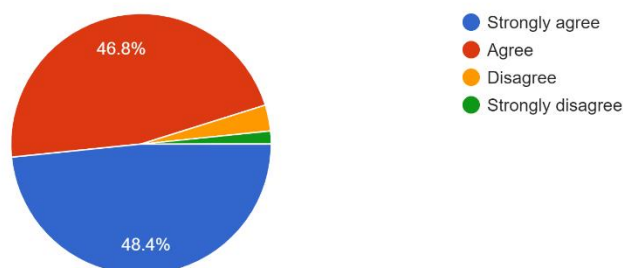
